The chart displays fingerings for the following notes and key signatures:

- Row 1: G (C major), G \flat /F \sharp (F major), F (C major), E (C major), E \flat /D \sharp (D major)
- Row 2: D (C major), D \flat /C \sharp (C major), C (C major), B (C major), B \flat /A \sharp (A major)
- Row 3: A (C major), A \flat /G \sharp (G major), G (C major), G \flat /F \sharp (F major), F (C major)
